Jennifer has also had the joy and privilege to work in diverse cultural and international contexts. At L'Unithéâtre (here in Edmonton) she facilitated French theatre workshops. Her work with Associazione Culturale Linguistica Educational toured her through Italy as an actor and workshop facilitator, teaching English through drama for various age groups with. Her role as a Dramatic English Workshop Facilitator in Guangzhou, China, and at Abu Dhabi Grammar School further demonstrates her versatility and dedication to using theatre as an educational tool.

In addition to her teaching role at WISE, Jennifer contributes to the arts community by creating new theatre for young audiences with Kompany Family Theatre, teaching at the French preschool 'Les Causeries', and curating the teen portion of a multi disciplinary arts festival.
