The Pumpkin Walk is a delightful autumn adventure where families are led down a glowing path of hand-carved pumpkins, taking part in a fun unfolding story. Along the way, they'll enjoy whimsical storytelling and fun interactive moments, all while soaking in the magical atmosphere. All are welcome to enjoy tasty treats and warm cider by donation while staying warm by an enchanting fire, connecting with one another in the liveliness of the holiday spirit. This joyful celebration of fall brings the community together, creating a playful, heartwarming experience filled with wonder, laughter, and the simple joys of the season.

WISE Charter School & WESE Winter Fair

Winter Fair is a magical afternoon where the entire school is transformed into a place of wonder and winter magic! It is a warm and enchanting celebration of the winter season, inviting families, friends, and neighbours to come together in a cozy, festive atmosphere, blending holiday traditions with creativity and community spirit. Families can enjoy gentle activities like candle dipping, seasonal crafts and storytelling, as well as delicious winter treats, handmade treasures, and moments of wonder such as the Floating Cookie Cave. Winter Fair is a beloved tradition that brings a sense of magic and togetherness, and inspires wonder and warmth during the holiday season.

Typically, Winter Fair runs from noon-4PM on Saturday, and is preceded by the Candlelight Market on Friday night from 7-9PM, which is an adult-only evening opportunity to access the holiday vendors. Winter Fair is a busy but magical event, requiring over 160 volunteers to be successful for our children and community alike! This typically means that each family in our school community will need to volunteer for at least one shift, and with 19 different roles to fill over two days, there is something that everyone will find enjoyable and comfortable doing!
