The journey toward Building our Dream Castle... and how you can help!

As you may have seen in a recent update from the WISE Charter Society, our proposal for a replacement K–9 school through Alberta Education's School Construction Accelerator Program (SCAP) is still under review. While originally expected within 90 days, earlier submissions were only approved in late summer, delaying our own timeline. We remain in regular contact with Alberta Education and will share news as soon as it arrives.

As we wait, together we can strengthen our proposal and lay the groundwork for a successful project once approval comes. A key factor in Alberta Education's decision is knowing that the City of Edmonton supports our land needs. This includes a potential land swap, the acquisition of additional land at our current site, and rezoning of the same. We continue to work behind the scenes with the City, but your voice can make a real difference right now.

A timely opportunity: October 20th Municipal Election

With the municipal election on October 20th, candidates are door-knocking and attending community events. This is the perfect time to speak up for WISE. Even if you do not live in Ottewell, an overall majority Council vote will be required for land approvals, so awareness across the city is invaluable.

How you can help

Improving neighbourhoods and enhancing children's safety are consistently identified priorities for City Council. Framing your conversations with candidates around these priorities while sharing WISE's story will help raise awareness of our school and its needs.

- WISE/WESE is a vibrant community school delivering Waldorf K 9 and early years education at a shared facility.
- Our existing building is old and in need of replacement, and the current site layout makes safety a top priority - especially since 2024's road narrowing created a chaotic pick-up and drop-off experience for families.
- A purpose-built Waldorf facility will provide the most enriching and supportive environment for Edmonton children's learning and wellbeing.
- Beautiful green spaces around the school are central to the Waldorf experience and outdoor education; such spaces would enhance the neighbourhood and serve the wider community.
- A tuition-free, purpose-built Waldorf school attracts families to Edmonton and surrounding areas, while enriching the city.



Your direct ask to candidates

Please support WISE's plan to build a replacement K - 9 school on our existing site and commit to voting in favour of the necessary land arrangements and rezoning at City Council.

Whether or not SCAP approval comes this year, every conversation you have with a candidate helps pave the way for our "dream castle" - a safe, beautiful, purpose-built Waldorf school for Edmonton families. Thank you for lending your voice and energy to this next step.

Pumpkin Walk

We are excited to return to Gold Bar Park and bring our traditional Pumpkin Walk to our community this year.

Here is some information for everyone:

The event itself is on **Saturday, October 25th**, from 5-8 pm at Gold Bar Park Picnic Site #2. Families purchase tickets in



advance, for a specific "tour time", and embark on a sweet little walk through the forest, on a path lit by many carved pumpkins. En route, they will encounter actors who will bring a story to life. There will be a bake and cider sale, which will be by cash donation. You will be able to gather and enjoy your treats around a large fire. Many people choose to dress up in costume for the event. It's sweet and simple and usually quite a lovely evening.

It should be noted that all who attend the walk must have a ticket, including volunteers and committee members. They are only **\$5** (no ticket needed for children three years old and younger) and are purchased in advance. Tickets sell out quickly every year, and the early time slots are the first to fill. So, if you have little ones for whom a bedtime is very important, please know that you will have to get your tickets ASAP.

Because we have limited space, tickets are only available for the immediate family members of the WISE Charter School and WESE members. Your friends and extended family are invited to come to our Winter Fair on November 29th.

We hope many people are looking forward to participating! We will need the usual bevy of volunteers to make this special event work and, as a perk for helping, all volunteers get early access to tickets, the chance to buy tickets for your family at just the right time. Some of the volunteer positions needed are: actors for the play, helping out the bake sale, and helpers for setup and clean up. If you would like to sign up and have access to advanced tickets, please ensure you're signed up by **NOON on WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 8th**. The link will be sent out that evening. Volunteers will have a few days to buy tickets before the link is made available to everyone on **SATURDAY, OCTOBER 11th**. Students in classes six through nine are welcome to sign up as well; lines will have to be learned at home with family support.

Things to know:

- Bring cash for the bake sale and cider (by donation)
- Bring a reusable mug for cider
- This is NOT the venue for scary costumes.
 We have lots of little people who come, so please keep the scary or overly commercial costumes for other parties and come in friendly and fun attire.
